

Next Steps

If you want input on how rail will be built on Richmond, you need to make sure your voice is heard. Here's how.

Civic organizations will be working with METRO and the city and will take positions on many of these issues. If you are a resident, start with your **local civic club**. All of the civic clubs between Shepherd and Spur 527 are members of the **Neartown Association** (www.neartown.org, ntaprez@hotmail.com), which meets monthly.
